Recently in my preparation to share with a local faith community, I was reflecting and processing to understand the 3rd commandment, "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain." Sometimes, we can see laws as dry rules and yet not take time to delve into their profound importance for those first receiving them and their implications for us in 2023. I found it goes

beyond mere avoidance of disrespecting God's name, that the phrase "to take" means "to carry". It emphasizes honouring the holiness and significance of God's name; His name is His character and authority. And we are to carry that in our actions and words. It calls believers to live in a way that brings glory to His name, and walk in His power and purposes to show the world truth and not make His name empty or worthless by our walk.

He gave order as our creator with a structure that would give a profound meaning, that would allow His people to know that the One giving the law deeply loves them and that His name is connected to His character and His love for them. In reflection, it shows us our need for a saviour as we in our human nature fall short of His command; Jesus provides redemption through the cross and bears our sin, offering forgiveness and restoration. Believers are called to authentically represent God's character, aligning our words and deeds with His holiness. And we are now set free to live free by the Holy Spirit as we carry the Lord's name.

YFC Comox Valley's vital role in working with youth adds a crucial layer to this important call. By providing guidance and support, we are instrumental in instilling hope in young lives. We offer youth a God-designed purpose through the Gospel message of Jesus and help them understand the significance of living in alignment with God's principles through His indwelling Holy Spirit, which is fundamental to living holistically transformed and free to reach their true potential.


nsforming Lives, Shaping Futures: A Grateful Testimonial for the Heroes Program at Phil & Jennie Gaglardi Academy

Over the past year my heart has been to see youth grow into who they were called to be and to walk out in the giftings and abilities that God has given them individually. To be able to create a space for youth to put into practice what their giftings are, as well as what they feel like God is calling them to.

This October we held our Giving in Thanksgiving event here at YFC, where I was able to take a group of youth out into the community and minister to the homeless. During that night I asked my group if anyone felt led to go and pray for someone specific, with a leader. A young girl who was new to YFC shot up her hand and said that there was a man who was sitting in a group that she felt led to pray for. Hi my name is Ava, and out of the last two years that I've done Giving in Thanksgiving, I've experienced many interactions that brought a smile to my face. I still remember last year when I met a man living on the streets who was also a believer in Jesus. When we gifted him a care package, he was so excited to receive it, especially the bus tickets; he said ecstatically, "Yes! I can finally go to church now!" Both years, as soon as we went to give out the care packages, I could just tell there was a spark of hope for these people in the gifts that we brought them. I hope that churches can continue to show care to this community.

A highlight from this year's opportunity to serve was going to the local warming centre and seeing the employees become so thankful that we were out there doing this ministry for God and how we had decided to give up our Friday night to do so. The fact that last year 20 youth attended the event and this year 50 youth were there was really amazing to see, as well as the amount of care packages we got to hand-deliver to people this year— almost 80 bags. It was a really fun experience that brought me out of my bubble, being able to talk to people and make small connections. I feel like I've made a difference in the community, both years I've attended this event. It has helped me as a person to see others around me in need. The main thing I can take away is that I learned that God can work through everyone in specific ways. I felt like God was using me as His helper to give these people a sense of hope that many people care for them and that God wants me to live with love, empathy and compassion.
